Dr. Bochner has been the Samuel M. Feinberg Professor of Medicine at Northwestern University, Feinberg School of Medicine in Chicago, Illinois, since 2013. He was previously on the faculty at Johns Hopkins University, School of Medicine in Baltimore, Maryland, for 35 years, where he was promoted to Professor in the Department of Medicine and became Director of the Division of Allergy and Clinical Immunology (2003-2013). Upon accepting his current position, he continued as Adjunct Professor of Medicine at Johns Hopkins.

Dr. Bochner received his medical degree from the University of Illinois, Abraham Lincoln School of Medicine in Chicago, where he also completed his residency. He went on to complete a fellowship in allergy and clinical immunology at Johns Hopkins University, School of Medicine.

His research career has concentrated on the role of eosinophils and mechanisms of allergic disease. His recent work has focused on siglec-8, ibrutinib, and acalabrutinib in his search for new treatments and preventions. Dr. Bochner is currently Associate Director of Mentoring for the NUAIR program, which provides training in translational research at Northwestern University. He is also involved with the Convergence Science Medicine Institute's pilot project on siglec-6 for ASM leukemia. He is an External Advisory Committee member of CEGIR (Consortium for Eosinophilic Gastrointestinal Disease Researchers), and his expertise has been sought for NIH Study Sections, AsthmaNet, and grant review for the Veterans Administration, foundations, The Wellcome Trust, AAAAI, and other organizations. Dr. Bochner holds 11 patents. More than 150 publications, as well as review articles, book chapters, and edited books, record his research findings.

Dr. Bochner's distinguished career includes leadership roles in many organizations. He recently completed a term as president of the International Eosinophil Society (2017-2019) and has served on the Executive Board and been Scientific Program Chair for annual meetings. He has served on the Board of Directors for both AAAAI and the American Board of Allergy and Immunology. He will be president of Collegium Internationale Allergologicum until 2022.

In 2019, Dr. Bochner received the Service award from the International Eosinophil Society and AAAAI's Mentorship award. The Feinberg School of Medicine honored him with their Fellow's Choice Excellence in Teaching award in 2015 and 2018.
