

**Anne Marie Singh, MD**

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Dr. Singh is an allergy and immunology specialist with a focus in pediatrics located in the Madison, Wisconsin area. In addition to her professorship at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health, where she was awarded tenure in 2018, she is Director of the university's Food Allergy Research and Education Center of Excellence. She is also an Adjunct Associate Professor in the Division of Allergy and Immunology at Northwestern Feinberg School of Medicine in Chicago, Illinois. At Feinberg, she was previously Associate Program Director for Translational Research in the Department of Pediatrics. She has held positions as Clinical Assistant Professor and as a postdoctoral research fellow at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health.

Dr. Singh received her medical degree in 2002 from Albert Einstein College of Medicine of Yeshiva University in Bronx, New York. Her residency in pediatrics was performed at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She completed a fellowship in allergy and immunology in 2009 at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health.

As an accomplished researcher, Dr. Singh has been awarded various grants for her work from the NIH and several foundations. She is currently principal investigator for a study on mechanisms of natural tolerance to nut allergies and for an NIH-funded study on childhood asthma, through the Children's Respiratory Research and Environment Workgroup (CREW). A recent grant established the University of Wisconsin as a Clinical Center of Excellence. Her past research has focused on T regulatory cells and *S. aureus* in food allergy, the severity spectrum of food allergy, and mechanisms of oral tolerance loss in food allergy. She has published more than 35 articles on these and other topics and is a frequent speaker at annual meetings of AAAAI (also serving as an abstract reviewer and session moderator), ACAAI, and Collegium Internationale Allergologicum. Respected in her field, she has served on Study Sections for NIAID and the Department of Defense. She was recently an Associate Scientific Advisor for *Science Translation Medicine*.

A member of AAAAI and a Leadership Institute Appointee, Dr. Singh chairs the work group on food allergy testing in atopic dermatitis and serves on three committees: Adverse Reactions to Foods Allergic Skin Diseases, and Cells and Mediators of Inflammation. She is also a member of the Society for Pediatric Research, the Food Research Institute, and the Collegium Internationale Allergologicum.

Dr. Singh has received two awards from the Feinberg School of Medicine, the New Investigator Career Development award and an Excellence in Teaching award. In 2018, she received a travel grant award from Collegium Internationale Allergologicum. She has also been the recipient of the Blowitz-Ridgeway Biomedical Research award and the Thrasher Research Fund's Early Career Award, both bestowed in 2010.
